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6 Steps To Follow

Step 1: Analyze The Script

Do you understand it? What's going on here? Check pronunciation of words, names, places

TIP: Google the word + pronunciation Search YouTube for videos where the name/place is spoken

Step 2: Who Are You Talking To?

One person only, not everyone What is their name? What do they look like? What are their aspirations, hopes, fears?

TIP:

Imagine you are speaking to a someone you know and love.

Step 3: Who Are You?

What is your relationship to the listener? Are you a friend, family member, helpful stranger, someone else?

TIP: Be fueled by a desperate desire to communicate.

Step 4: Place

Where are you when you are having this conversation?

TIP:

Visualize a familiar place you know. Match place to product (food spots in your kitchen, work scenarios in your office etc.).

Step 5: The Moment Before

What happened immediately before the action in the script began?

Why are you having this conversation with someone?

TIP:

The first words in the script should be the answer to an imaginary question from the person you are speaking to.

Make up a few relevant lines and say them aloud before you begin the script

Step 6: What's Your P.O.V (Point Of View)?

Are you in the action or observing it? Are you the voice of their conscience?





5 TECH TIPS

- 1. Get a professional USB mic and plug it directly into your computer.
- 2. Make sure your computer recognizes your mic.
- 3. Use a fabric pop screen in front of the mic.
- 4. Position the mic a hands-width away from your mouth. Adjust from there.
- 5. Go green! Instead of printing out your script read it on your smart phone or mobile device.

4 BONUS TIPS!

- 1. Don't be an announcer. Speak as if you are talking to a friend.
- 2. Put a picture of a loved one next to the mic, look them in the eyes and talk.
- 3. Don't try to act and direct yourself at the same time!
- 4. A walk-in closet is an excellent place to record, but don't remove the clothing. It helps deaden the sound.
